*Book Report: Under and Alone by William Queen*

When I travel by air I usually do one of two things to pass the time: read or sleep. Unless I'm already in the middle of a book which I take along, I treat myself to a shopping opportunity in

an airport bookstore. Time was, the selection of reading material in airport shops was about that in your average gas station mini-mart. However, as the bookstores in major airports have improved to

be on a par with major book retail outlets, I always look forward to some leisurely browsing, time allowing, before making my final choice for the flight.

On my most recent trip, I bought a copy of Stephen White's *Missing Persons*. It's a mystery and the first of the author's I've read. I suppose it could be called a psychological thriller as well; more than one of the characters, including the first-person narrator and one of the murder victims, are practicing, licensed psychologists. The idiosyncrasies of their clients provide some of the texture and humor to the story. The setting is predominantly contemporary Boulder, Colorado, with a little of the action reported from in and around Las Vegas. It is mostly well written and very readable, and I would recommend it to anyone not specifically allergic to the genre.

For the return trip, I had a somewhat more limited choice, but couldn't resist sampling something from the dark and sleazy side of motorcycling. *Under and Alone* is the story of an undercover agent of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) infiltrating the violent and criminal Mongols motorcycle gang. The agent, William Queen, who tells the story, operated within the ranks of the gang for two years to gather evidence to prosecute the gang's criminal activities.

The most remarkable thing about undercover work is the length of time an agent must masquerade, nearly 24 hours a day, to build the trust and respect of those he's investigating. The toll is high due to the separation from family and friends, not to mention living under the constant threat that to be discovered is to die. In Queen's case, he lost his wife and became estranged from his son because of his total immersion into the biker gang culture.

One of the more interesting aspects was Queen's carefully staged entry into the gang. On his own he had to present himself at known Mongol hangouts, become acquainted with some of the members, and slowly gain their trust and respect to the point he was invited to join them in some of their activities and ultimately to join. More than once he had to perform a delicate dance and quick-thinking diplomacy to avoid having to commit outright murder to prove himself to the gang.

The first stage of membership is a period of initiation in which the potential new member is addressed as "Prospect." He is considered property of the club and must do the bidding of any of the regular members. After a suitable period and he is deemed worthy, a prospect becomes a "full-patch" member, allowed to wear the complete insignia of the gang on the back of a leather or denim vest.

The Mongols are headquartered in southern California and are sworn enemies of the Hells Angels. In fact, the outbreak of violence at the 2002 Laughlin River Run was a clash between these two gangs. That was two years after Queen's investigation which was carried out from 1998-2000. His work was successful. Many of the Mongols were prosecuted for their criminal activity, including murder, drug dealing, rape, gunrunning, robbery, etc.

The story is well told and fast moving. It allows one to satisfy a little morbid curiosity about the underworld of criminal biker gangs and revel in the fact that at least some were brought to justice.

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## **BMW lowers cost of ownership**

Most people feel that the Integral ABS brake system BMW introduced with the 2002 models was an advancement over the older systems, but it has proven to be more expensive to maintain. The job is time consuming with multiple circuits and bleed points, and the ABS Hydro unit is not very accessible on some models.

BMW recently released a service bulletin reducing the frequency of the brake fluid change intervals for models which are factory equipped with the Stahlflex braided steel brake hoses. Field studies conducted by BMW concluded that moisture absorption by the brake fluid has been significantly reduced by the use of the Stahlflex hoses. As a result, BMW has changed the recommended brake fluid intervals as follows:

I-ABS "wheel circuit" brake fluid change (Hydro unit to caliper): was required every year, is now required every 2 years.

I-ABS "control circuit" brake fluid change (master cylinder to Hydro unit): was required every 2 years, is now required every 4 years.

Non-ABS models with Stahlflex hoses: was required every year, is now required every 2 years.

The change from one year to two years on the wheel circuit is only for models equipped with the Stahlflex braided steel hoses. I-ABS models equipped with standard rubber hoses must still have the wheel circuit fluid changed annually.

However the change on the control circuit brake fluid from two years to four years applies to all I-ABS models regardless of hose type.

Non-ABS models with rubber hoses or older models with ABS I or ABS II still must have the brake fluid changed annually.

This chart might help:

<b>Brake fluid service</b>	<b>Rubber Brake Hose</b>	<b>Stahlflex Brake Hose</b>
Non ABS models	every year	every 2 years
Integral ABS Wheel Circuit	every year	every 2 years
Integral ABS Control Circuit	every 4 years	every 4 years

Although these are new official BMW recommendations, common sense should prevail. If it is determined that your brake fluid has discolored or shows other signs of contamination, it should be changed regardless of age. If you're not sure how old your brake fluid is, have it changed now, and start a regimen that will ensure the health of your brake system.




