Hamilton Road, which held a few unpleasant surprises in the form of bone-jarring dips in the pavement. Otherwise it was a pleasant, scenic climb to the top.

Once at the summit, we took in the view, had a bit of a rest, and then availed ourselves of one of the tours of the old observatory. When it was time to negotiate the route down the back side of the mountain, Ed and Brooke took their leave and returned the way we had come.

That left five of us to make the run out Del Puerto

Canyon. Our progress was halted for a few minutes at one point with some comic relief in the form of a rancher on an ATV trying to convince a wayward steer back into the confines of a fence.
